

ORDINANCE NO. 2018-8

AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$4,400.00 FROM THE CAPITAL FUND BALANCE FOR LIGHTING RENOVATIONS TO BOROUGH HALL BY THE BOROUGH OF ELMER, COUNTY OF SALEM, STATE OF NEW JERSEY

WHEREAS, the Borough of Elmer Council received an audit from the Direct Install Program (NJ Clean Energy) for energy efficiency upgrades in the Borough Hall that resulted in an agreement to upgrade the lighting for an estimated sum of \$12,000.00; and

WHEREAS, the terms and conditions of the agreement with the Direct Install Program (NJ Clean Energy) requires the Borough to provide 30% of the total costs for said lighting renovations for an estimated amount of \$4,400.00; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Elmer deem it in the best interest of the Borough to appropriate \$4,400.00 from the Capital Fund Balance for lighting renovations to Borough Hall; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Elmer find the lighting renovation to Borough Hall is an important public concern and is necessary to implement, and will create savings in the Borough's utility bills.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Elmer, in the County of Salem and State of New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1.

The amount of \$4,400.00 is hereby appropriated from the Capital Fund Balance for lighting renovations to Borough Hall, including all work and materials incidental thereto, and all costs and expenditures related thereto, in and by the Borough of Elmer, in the County of Salem, State of New Jersey.

Section 2.

The Borough hereby certifies that it has adopted a capital budget or a temporary capital budget, as applicable. The capital or temporary capital budget of the Borough is hereby amended to confirm with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. To the extent that the purposes authorized herein are inconsistent with the adopted capital or temporary capital budget, a revised capital or temporary capital budget has been filed with the Division of Local Government Services.

Section 3.

Repealer.

All prior Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent with this Ordinance be and the same are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistencies.

Section 4.

Severability.

Should any section, clause, sentence, phrase or provision of this Ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid by a Court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

Section 4.

When effective.

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication in accordance with law.
