# **Inspection Checklist**

#### **House Numbers**

- o Numbers are numerical characters, contrasting color from the house, at least 4" in height, permanently affixed to the house & visible from the street.
  - Please check your local ordinance regarding address posting as well. If the local ordinance guidelines are stricter that what is listed above, please follow the ordinance.

#### Smoke Alarms- UL approved

- o 10-year battery sealed smoke alarm located on every level of the dwelling or \*hardwired as required
- o Basement level 10-year battery sealed alarm is located at bottom of stair well, at ceiling level (not between joists)
- o All bedrooms must have a 10-year sealed alarm
- \*Electric smoke alarms (Hardwire) CANNOT be replaced with battery operated alarms
- O Smoke alarms are less than 10 years old and are operational
- \*Any house equipped with a low voltage fire alarm system (installed by an alarm company) must have that system tested and approved by an alarm contractor prior to the Bureau of Fire Prevention inspection date. A copy of the alarm certification provided by the alarm company must be presented to the Bureau of Fire Prevention inspector at the time of the inspection.

**DO NOT** install smoke alarms in the kitchens, bathrooms, near forced air ducts or furnaces, in the "dead air" space where the ceiling meets the wall, close to ceiling fans, in crawls spaces, or attics

### Carbon Monoxide Alarms- UL Approved

- o Located in the hallway, within 10 feet of ALL bedrooms
- o Installed as per the manufacturer's instructions
- o Carbon monoxide alarms(s) are less than 10 years old and are operational

**DO NOT** place alarms in electrical outlets than can be turned off by a switch or that are located against floor molding. Plug-in, battery powered, and hardwired CO alarms are acceptable.

### **Secondary Power Source Identification Label**

If the home has a secondary power source there is a new requirement to have a permanent label by the main electrical panel **AND** the electric meter. Secondary power sources may include: solar panels, backup power generator, battery storage systems, or any other supplemental source of electrical energy to the primary power supply.

The label must be marked with wording similar to "Caution: Multiple Sources of Power"

This label may **NOT** be hand written. A label compliant with ANSI Z535.4 will meet the requirements.
